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COURSE DESCRIPTION

In this course, learners bring forward nursing knowledge to examine current trends and issues in nursing practice. Underpinned in entry-level competencies for Licensed Practical Nurses, learners explore the roles of the Practical Nurse as a collaborative member of a health care team, a leader, an advocate and a novice researcher.
