Instructions for Use

This planning guide is meant to assist you in selecting your courses each term. Read carefully, as some courses are only offered in one term/year and some are offered in multiple terms/years.

Graduation Requirements and Yukon First Nations Core Competency

The Early Learning diploma is awarded for the completion of the equivalent of two years of study (60 credits) in the program. Program core courses, including ENGL 100 are mandatory for graduation.

To graduate, students must pass all the required courses, and:

- 1. complete 50% of the course work at Yukon College/Yukon University; and
- 2. maintain a 2.00 cumulative GPA (C average) across all courses.

Yukon First Nations Core Competency

Yukon University recognizes that a greater understanding and awareness of Yukon First Nations' history and culture and journey towards self-determination will help to build positive relationships among all Yukon citizens. As a result, you will be required to achieve core competency in knowledge of Yukon First Nations. Students in the EL program acquire knowledge related to the First Nation Core Competencies through core program content and meet the graduation requirement. The Early Learning diploma can be completed in two years by students who choose to attend full time, with a 5-course-per-term load. Most Early Learning students complete the program through part -time studies over a longer period.

Students wanting to register in a 200-level course without having completed the 100-level courses may require the permission of Early Learning faculty.

Early Learning theory courses are generally delivered as evening classes; field placements are in the daytime during Early Learning Centre hours of operation.
